Start A Ministry at 68? Why not?

Did you ever wonder how God would use you in your lifetime? Did you ever feel your opportunity to impact the world just passed you by? Think again, brother! Today, I met a man who began a ministry half way around the world when he was 68 years old, grey-haired and retired. His name is Joe Bodanza. He started working with teens from Vietnam in 1995, many years after the end of the Vietnam War.

This is how it all came about. Joe was asked by a young Vietnamese man to travel with him to his home country to see his parents. Joe agreed to go. There Joe got to see the country and fall in love with the people. Having experienced polio himself as a child, Joe's heart was torn to see many children in Vietnam with polio, scoliosis, and other physical deformities. These little ones did not have the medical care available to help them thrive.

Using all his financial resources, Joe started his work by bringing one youngster to Massachusetts for care. This young man improved greatly here in the US with the care of Shriner's Hospitals in Springfield and Boston. Inspired to do more, Joe Bodanza began offering assistance to more Vietnamese teens. Korean Airlines offered free transportation for this effort. Soon Joe's dream of helping disabled young people became an incorporated entity, Child Medical Connection, Inc. of Leominster, Mass.

"I tried to help them spiritually and materially," says Joe, who ended up selling a home in Gardner to pay off debts incurred from the new organization. But money did not matter to Joe, "It didn't mean anything," he said.

Because Joe had 7 to 10 students living as a group, he rented 4 apartments to house the boys and girls who came for medical help. Most returned to Vietnam after 6 months in the States. Some of the young people committed their lives to Jesus Christ as Joe took care of them and provided time for church attendance.

As Joe aged, he adapted his work in Vietnam to helping needy children and teens with funds to provide dental work, vision care, and school tuition. His tiny apartment is full of filing cabinets holding the file folders of hundreds of children he helped with sponsorships.

Of course, Joe had the financial help of donors, and the invaluable help of Nguyen Hoang Tuan (Tuan) a young man who has received medical treatment and education here in the US. The Lord has been Joe's Guiding Hand through it all. Joe said, "When God closes a door, He opens a window. God provides windows in all our lives."

There is a lot more to be written about the work of Joe Bodanza. Maybe your heart is touched by his work. Maybe your spirit and mind sense a new direction for your energy. Perhaps a window is opening today!

Name: Joe Bodanza, unmarried, no children (unless you count the *hundreds* he has taught as a language teacher, or the youngsters of Vietnam that he helped to receive education and medical care).

Age: "I am 87 years young!"

Residence: Lives in small apartment in Leominster, in the neighborhood behind the Mall at Whitney Fields.

Health: It is what you can expect for an octogenarian. He can still drive but needs help getting to doctors' appointments.

Care Needs: Joe could use a friendly visit (especially on Mondays or Tuesdays) to check in on him. Occasionally, on a weekend night, he would be comforted to have someone present overnight. Food is appreciated, but definitely soft foods like pasta, soups, fruits and vegetables.

4th Annual "Hope for Nica" 5K

Saturday, May 2nd marked the day of the 4th Annual "Hope for Nica" 5K. Signs, Facebook, word of mouth and a flyer in our Sunday bulletin got the invitation out. "Come join us as we walk/run for Nica! Help educate, feed, clothe children from the El Padul Christian school in Nicaragua!"

Early that morning, cars, trucks and trailers full of supplies for the event came rolling into the NeWest mall plaza. Under Marla Somero's direction, volunteers set up tents and tables for registration, food, raffle items and prizes. A bounce house and inflated slide were brought in to entertain the children. Marla is known for her attention to detail and when everything was in its place, the site was beautiful! Meanwhile, Lars Sauvola worked on marking out the route for the runners and walkers.

It was a cool and sunny day, perfect temperatures for a 5K run.

Soon people began lining up to register and receive their bib numbers and t-shirts. As 9 a.m. got close, the crowd moved next door to Hutter Construction to find a place at the "Start" line. One hundred thirty people had registered. After a short speech and a prayer, the race was on! A group hung back at the finish line to cheer the runners in. Eighteen minutes, twenty-seven seconds later, the first runner, Avery Traffie, crossed the line. He was followed by Adam Traffie just fifteen seconds behind. For the next hour, runners and eventually walkers, some pushing strollers, crossed the finish line as a crowd clapped and cheered. One man crossed over in a wheelchair; he'd worked hard at navigating New Ipswich hills.

Every runner had a story and a reason for being there. Some had steadily trained with an eye on the first place prize. Others had decided that morning to run. A few accompanied a friend or spouse, holding back on his own ability and letting the weaker one set the pace. It was exciting to hear that cancer, aging, childbearing, loss of a limb, little time to practice-none of these challenges deterred runners and walkers from being at the 4th Annual Hope for Nica 5K. "We run for the food!" one woman told me enthusiastically after the race, as she dished out homemade yogurt and granola, fresh fruit and delicious pastries from the food table. The race was exciting; the activities and food afterward were rewarding and memorable. The best part is that participants shared a satisfying experience and became anonymous benefactors to the children of El Padul Christian School in Nicaragua. This was truly an exciting race, well run!

Stewardship Corner

Counsel

(Chapter 4)

The way of a fool is right in his own eyes, But he who heeds counsel is wise.

Proverbs 12:15 NKJV

The American Heritage Dictionary defines *wisdom* as - "1. Understanding of what is true, right, or lasting. 2. Common sense; sagacity; good judgment: "*It is a characteristic of wisdom not to do desperate things"* (Thoreau).

The Liberty Illustrated Bible Dictionary defines *wisdom* as – ability to judge correctly and to follow the best course of action, based on knowledge and understanding.

Two attitudes keep us from seeking counsel:

- 1. *Pride:* Our culture perceives seeking advice as a sign of weakness. We are often times encouraged to stand on our own two feet and that we do not need anyone to help us make a decision. Major advertisers coerce us to make impulse decisions because they know if we seek counsel it may lead to a lost sale.
- 2. Stubbornness: We often times resist seeking counsel or advice because we know that when we are objectively confronted with the facts, the decision would go against our emotional desires.

Recommended sources of wise counsel:

1. Scripture:

- a. Psalm 119:24 "Your testimonies also are my delight and my counselors."
- b. Psalm 119:98-99 "You, through Your commandments, make me wiser than my enemies; for they are ever with me. I have more understanding than all my teachers, For Your testimonies are my meditation."
- c. Proverbs 19:20 "Listen to counsel and receive instruction, that you may be wise in your latter days."
- d. Proverbs 10:8 "The wise in heart will receive commands, but a prating fool will fall."

2. Counsel of Godly People:

a. Psalm 37:30-31 "The mouth of the righteous speaks wisdom, and his tongue talks of justice. The law of his God is in his heart;"

3. Spouse:

- a. It will preserve your relationship: Both should agree because you will both experience the consequences. Even if the choice proves to be disastrous, the relationship remains intact and there are no grounds for "I told you so".
- b. It honors your spouse: Seeking your spouse's counsel helps develop a healthy self-esteem with your spouse and it communicates that "I love you, I respect you and I value your insight."
- c. It prepares your spouse for the future: It is an effective way to communicate and insure your spouse is attuned to your thought process, especially with regard to future planning, finances and commitments.

4. Parents:

a. Proverbs 6:20-22 "My son, keep your father's command, and do not forsake the law of your mother. Bind them continually upon your heart; Tie them around your neck. When you roam, they will lead you; when you sleep, they will keep you; and when you awake, they will speak with you."

5. Experienced People:

 We should consult with people that are respected and experienced in the particular area that we are making a decision; real estate, automobiles, doctors, etc. and insure it aligns with scripture.

6. A Multitude of Counselors:

- a. Proverbs 15:22 "Without counsel, plans go awry, but in the multitude of counselors they are established."
- b. Proverbs 11:14 "Where there is no counsel, the people fall; But in the multitude of counselors there is safety."
- c. Ecclesiastes 4:9-12 "Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their labor. For if they fall, one will lift up his companion. But woe to him who is alone when he falls, for he has no one to help him up. Again, if two lie down together, they will keep warm; but how can one be warm alone?

d. Though one may be overpowered by another, two can withstand him. And a threefold cord is not quickly broken."

7. Counsel of the Lord:

- a. Psalm 32:8 "I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will guide you with My eye."
- b. Psalm 73:24 "You will guide me with Your counsel, and afterward receive me to glory."
- c. Psalm 16:7 "I will bless the Lord who has given me counsel; my heart also instructs me in the night seasons."

Counsel to avoid:

- 1. Counsel of the wicked:
 - a. Psalm 1:1 "Blessed is the man who walks not in the counsel of the ungodly, Nor stands in the path of sinners, Nor sits in the seat of the scornful;"
- 2. Fortune tellers, mediums and spiritualists:
 - a. Leviticus 19:31 "Give no regard to mediums and familiar spirits; do not seek after them, to be defiled by them: I am the Lord your God."
 - b. 1 Chronicles 10:13-14 "So Saul died for his unfaithfulness which he had committed against the Lord, because he did not keep the word of the Lord, and also because he consulted a medium for guidance. ¹⁴ But he did not inquire of the Lord; therefore He killed him, and turned the kingdom over to David the son of Jesse."
- 3. Biased Counsel: What stake does the one offering counsel have in the outcome of your decision?

This information is from the Dictionary, Bible and Crown Financial Biblical Study. There is a small group study offered by Crown Financial, led by Bob & Sheila O'Brien. The series covers the major stewardship topics and can help you develop a balanced biblical approach that when followed will lead to reduced financial strain and a great plan while still relying fully on the Lord.



Authority of the Holy Bible

As a Christian living in a world where some people do not share the same beliefs in Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit and God our father many questions arise as to why a believer has faith. In the book of Peter we are encouraged as followers of Christ to be prepared for questions from unbelievers "But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give and answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect. (1Pet. 3:15). The answers that Peter is speaking about are found in God's word- the Holy Bible. This essay will examine how the Bible is indeed God's word and that it has power.

Authority of the Bible

The first topic that needs to be addressed is establishing that the Bible has authority. After all the Holy Bible should be the guideline in which Christians live their lives in obedience to God. Jesus who the Bible determines is the Son of God, who came to save mankind from sin, spoke and healed with authority (Matt 7:29). Authority can also be inherent, when Jesus was asked by what authority he taught and acted he implied that the power was external (Elwell, 2001), as it came from his father in heaven. So Jesus clearly defines that his power comes from God to serve a purpose. The book of John declares that the word was with God and then took the form of human flesh- Jesus (John 1). Jesus the "word" came with authority therefore God's word the Bible has authority. The Prophets of the Old Testament found their certainty in God's revelation (Elwell, 2001) The Old Testament prophets also predicted historical events that came true such as Israel's fall to Babylon, the birth of Christ and many other historical markers.

Questions about the Authority of The Bible

Many liberal theologians question the authority of scripture and declare that it is mostly mad-made (Elwell, 2001). This theory however presents inconstancies- "for insofar as it wishes the acceptance of its own unbiblical speculation it has to denounce the authority of the Bible" (Elwell, 2001). Or to put it more simply the Bible must be entirely true or entirely false. God declares that the Bible is indeed all true.

Inspiration of the Bible

The Apostle Paul tells us "all scripture is God-breathed and useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness." (2 Tim 3:16). This is a very accurate and lively way to establish that God gave life to scripture just as he breathed life and created the earth and everything in it.

Inerrancy of the Bible

Inerrancy means to be without error. The Bible is inerrant. In 1978, 268 evangelical scholars met to at a conference in Chicago- to win Christians to the view of inerrancy (Elwell, 2001). They summarized that God only speaks truth, the Bible "written by men" was superintended by the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit the divine author illumines readers and authenticates scripture, the Bible is without error in all of its teaching, the Bible's authority is impaired if inerrancy is impaired or denied (Elwell, 2001).

Questions of Inerrancy

Some believe that because men wrote the Bible that there might be mistakes. For this question refer back to 2 Timothy where Paul declares that *all* scripture is God-Breathed and useful (2 Tim 3:16). If all scripture is God Breathed then it is perfect for God is perfect.

Relationship between Inspiration and Inerrancy

God is perfect and without blemish. His son Jesus also "had no sin" (2 Cor 5:21) and was blameless. God who breathed (2 Tim) the scriptures into life is inerrant. His son Jesus Christ who in the beginning was the "word" is also inerrant. The relationship between God and his word are much like the relationship with the father and son. God sent both and both are without error.

Personal Summarization

As I review the topics of scriptures authority, inspiration and inerrancy in the context of my own life I conclude that- God is perfect, He breathed scripture to life that we may know him and make him known, scripture is without error or contradiction as the Holy Spirit superintended the writing of scripture. I believe that a Christians should live their lives in accordance to The Bible. That sin has corrupted man and scripture is intended to remind us to focus our lives on Christ (Matt 6:33) that we must seek him. We must also do as Peter said, "But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always

be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks to give a reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." (1 Pet. 3:15) The answers must be founded from the authoritative, inspirational work of God that is without blemish... The Holy Bible.

Recipe to Share

FRUIT PIZZA

Crust:

1 c. butter, softened

1 ½ c. sugar

1 egg

1 tsp. vanilla

2 3/4 c. flour

1 tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. baking powder

1/4 tsp. salt

Place butter and sugar in mixing bowl. Beat well with electric mixer. Add egg and vanilla. Mix until incorporated. In separate bowl, combine flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt. Stir in to the ingredients in mixing bowl and mix well until all combined. Divide dough in half. Shape into 2 logs. Wrap in waxed paper or plastic wrap and refrigerate at least 1 hour. You may freeze 1 log for later or bake both now. Slice into circles and place together on greased pizza pan or cookie sheet. Press circles together, forming one large, round cookie crust. Bake at 375 degrees for 12 minutes. Cool completely. Repeat with 2nd dough log, if desired.

Frosting for 1 pizza:

8 oz. cream cheese, softened

1/3 c. sugar

½ tap. vanilla

Combine cream cheese, sugar and vanilla. Beat well. Spread over cooled crust. (Double for 2 crusts).

Toppings:

strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, blackberries, manadarin oranges or fruits of your choice.

Arrange berries and mandarin oranges over the cream cheese layer. Refrigerate until serving.
